

Marisa H. Miceli, MD



Dr Miceli is an Assistant Professor in the Division of Infectious Diseases at the University of Michigan Medical School. Her research interests include infections, especially fungal infections in the immunocompromised host with special interest in invasive aspergillosis and endemic fungal infections and in stem cell and solid organ transplant recipients. She is actively involved in studies on the clinical application of novel technologies for diagnosis of fungal infections and in clinical trials on new agents for treatment of fungal infections.

Dr Miceli earned her medical degree from the University of Buenos Aires School of Medicine in Argentina. She completed residency training in Internal Medicine and fellowships in Infectious Diseases and Transplantation in Buenos Aires. After immigrating to the U.S., Dr. Miceli again completed residency training, did an Infectious Diseases Fellowship at the University of New Mexico, and did a Transplant Infectious Diseases Fellowship at Henry Ford Hospital in Detroit. She also spent several years conducting research on infectious complications in myeloma patients at the Myeloma Institute for Research and Therapy at the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences. She joined the faculty of the Infectious Diseases Division at the University of Michigan in 2013.

Dr Miceli has published 56 manuscripts in peer-reviewed journals, including *Clinical Infectious Diseases*, *The Lancet Infectious Diseases*, *Infectious Disease Clinics of North America*, and *Mycoses*, and she has published 3 book chapters. She is a member of the International Immunocompromised Host Society, the Mycoses Study Group Education and Research Consortium, the Infectious Diseases Society of America, the American Society of Transplantation, and is a Fellow of the American College of Physicians.
