Steven A. Pergam, MD, MPH is an Associate Member in both the Clinical Research Division and the Vaccine and Infectious Disease Division of the Fred Hutchinson Cancer Research Center, Seattle, WA, USA. He is also an Associate Professor in the Department of Medicine, Division of Allergy and Infectious Diseases, at the University of Washington and an adjunct Associate Professor in the Department of Epidemiology, School of Public Health at the University of Washington. He serves as the Medical Director of Infection Prevention and is an attending physician at the Seattle Cancer Care Alliance. Dr. Pergam focuses his research on the prevention and treatment

of infections among immunocompromised patients and has expertise in infection prevention and hospital epidemiology among cancer and transplant patients. He has lectured, published, and mentored students on the prevalence and diagnosis of major viral, fungal and bacterial infections in this population. He serves on numerous national committees including the CDC's Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices, the American Society of Blood and Marrow Transplant's Transplant Infectious Diseases Special Interest Group and the National Comprehensive Cancer Network Committee on the Prevention and Treatment of Infections in Cancer, and the National Academy of Sciences Committee on the Management of Legionella in Water Systems. He is an associate editor of *Current Opinions in Infectious Diseases* and *BMC Infectious Diseases*, and plays an active role in Transplant Infectious Diseases/Infection Prevention social media through Twitter. In 2014, he was elected to be a fellow of the Infectious Disease Society of America. He received his B.A. from Dartmouth College, his M.D. from the University of Nebraska, his infectious diseases fellowship training at the University of Washington, and his M.P.H. from the University of Washington, School of Public Health.
